Can there ever be another civil rights leader like Martin Luther King, Jr., who organized non-violent movements to protest against segregation, human rights, and poverty? His fight for equality during the 1950's and until his death was challenging but he was determined to make changes in America.

King was successful in organizing many protests and boycotts. His first major victory was a boycott on the segregated bus lines in Montgomery, Alabama in 1956. He organized the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, which gave him the opportunity to talk about civil rights. Even though his belief was to use non-violence, he was arrested numerous times for violence. He continued to protest in the South and this helped him to gain attention worldwide. His march on Washington, D.C., attracted

more than 200,000 people to hear his now famous speech "I Have a Dream." The following year he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.

Martin Luther King, Jr. was a very educated man. He attended Morehouse College, Crozer Theological Seminary, and Boston University where he attained his Ph.D. in 1955. He was also the son of a pastor which influenced him to follow in the same footsteps. He became a minister of a baptist church in Montgomery, Alabama in 1947.

His character came from his upbringing, experience, and education and made him one of the most inspirational speakers in America. He argued to change unjust laws, for equality among all ethnic groups, and opposed the war in Vietnam. This is why we honor and celebrate his birthday on January 21st.

Free and Open Web

More than a third of people on the planet is using the internet. The web empowers people, creates a reason for people to search for information, and allows individuals to share their voice. It is not controlled by anyone, but will that change in the future? Freedom on the internet is being tested. Closed-door meetings are being held because governments want to manipulate the internet themselves. Forty-two countries have filters and censored internet. In just two years, specific governments have already proposed 19 new laws threatening free expression on the internet.

In December, the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) gathered representatives from around the world to negotiate a treaty. Services like Facebook, Youtube, Skype, Twitter, Tumblr, and others would be affected. By changing policies there would be limited access to information. Only governments can be a part of the ITU meeting. This excludes ordinary web users that support freedom on the internet.

Engineers, companies, and users of the web do not have a voice in this decision. Opposition from the public has been sweeping the nation. They have created organizations and voiced their opinions on the internet. Even Google, the most powerful search engine, is against this. Now it is up to you. Which side will you choose?

Breaking The Chains

It is estimated that over 30 million people are enslaved in the world today. Slavery is a word that sounds outdated and non-existent to many Americans. In fact, it is still practiced not only in third world countries, but here in the United States; the place we have all come to know as "home of the free." For those who do not know, President Barack Obama has proclaimed January as National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month. This problem has grown massively. The problem is so massive that our very own President has bestowed and dedicated this month to its existence. Although we do not directly see human trafficking every day, others do. Modern-day slavery has developed into many forms. The most common forms of slavery are: human trafficking, sex trafficking, and child labor. About 15,000-17,500 people are trafficked into the United States annually. When traffickers get a hold on their victims, they are often beaten, drugged, locked up and starved. They are forced to work under excruciating conditions. Victims are usually forced to work in farms, factories, child centers, massage parlors, or sweatshops with little or no pay. You might be asking yourself 'Why don't they get help?' 'Why don't they get out of this situation?' Most of the time they're lured into believing that these traffickers have work for them to help support their family financially. However, they are lies. They're held captive either by force or by threats, but the most common threat is harm to their families. Sadly, people are tricked into this devastating trap by falling for false promises of jobs, of marriage, or of education. The target age for sex trafficking is between the ages of 12-18 years old. The difference between human and sex trafficking is that sex trafficking requires sexual exploitation, in simpler

words prostituting. Traffickers pursue potential victims who come from broken or dysfunctional homes. Traffickers target runaway, neglected, desperate, and juvenile delinquent youths who are looking for love and acceptance. Poverty is the cause for most human trafficking, both in the United States and in third world countries. However, in third world countries it is most common for young adults and children to be sold into human trafficking by relatives or friends. Victims perpetually have difficulty leaving their traffickers and have to resort to escape in order to acquire their freedom. Unfortunately, many never make it out alive, meanwhile being held captive against their will to repay a debt. Their lives are in constant danger and are terrorized regularly. "Every year an estimated 12 million children are being trafficked." The children who are being trafficked are under the age of 12, and are being sold as if they are products. Traffickers either kidnap, or lure children into selling merchandise as well as other slave work. For the most part it is becoming most popular for children to be placed in parking lots to sell candy, magazines, or candles. The daily lives of these trafficked children involve starvation, constant threats, violence, and forced drug use. Another common area of work that children are being coerced into is prostitution and selling drugs. Traffickers specifically target children as young as six and as old as 14. Children and teenagers often find themselves in these situations due to lack of love and mistreatment at home. They go out into the world seeking love, and in doing so they encounter traffickers who offer them all they seek for the time being.

It is impossible to conquer this overwhelming dilemma on our own, especially since it exists throughout the world. In order to combat human trafficking overall, make others aware of what you know about it. Tell a friend, a cousin, a sister, a brother, or just anyone. Educating just one person can make a huge difference. There are many movies and documentaries you could refer to them to watch. Some recent and popular movies that display human trafficking are: Taken, Trade of Innocents, The Whistle Blower, and Slum Dog Millionaire. Those three forms of human trafficking are our modern-day slavery. It is a severe problem that not only exists in third world countries, but also here in the United States! We are facing the third most common illegal crime that is so massive in today's era that it cannot be ignored any longer. The best way to fight human trafficking is to educate ourselves and our loved ones about human trafficking and in doing so, we will prevent less victims from falling into those death traps. One local group known as The Light Ministry fights trafficking here in Riverside County. Their motto is "Liberating the imprisoned and giving hope to the taken." Their mission is to enlighten people throughout Riverside county about human trafficking, and to give a voice to those who cannot speak for themselves. Their hope is to break off the chains of these victims, and give them their freedom.
